Incidents

Our crime free spell has ended with a report that a locked shed was broken into and a chain saw and hedge cutter stolen. It was also sad to hear that someone had taken a tin of coffee from the church.

Please be on your guard as we obviously have thieves operating in the village.

Oil Thefts

As the weather gets colder heating oil becomes a target for thieves so it is worthwhile taking a few steps to protect your oil. Remote electronic oil level gauges are now available which will set off an audible alarm if the oil level in the tank suddenly drops or falls below a quarter full. These gauges can be located in the kitchen, or perhaps a utility room to warn of any potential problem. Some alarms will emit an audible alarm if the tank rate drops 1.5cm in a minute, which is not common in a domestic tank.

If you have a lockable tank a close shackle padlock is a good idea as bolt croppers cannot grip these.

Cold Calling

As some residents have expressed a wish for “Cold Callers” to continue to be allowed in the village we are unable to take any further action in this matter. Stopping Cold Calling requires the agreement of all residents.
