Village Hall

Parish Council

Member Vacancy – There was one application to fill the vacancy left by the death of Mike Burton and Dr Brooker has been asked to join the Council.

HGV traffic – There is concern that ERYC are not acting swiftly enough in improving passing places on Norfolk Bank Lane to allow for the additional heavy traffic load. As well as Nursery traffic, this narrow road is dealing with work on the extension to the Sewage Works at Bow Bridge and the Environment Agency's earth moving activity to increase the height of the flood bank between Crabley and Brough.



A letter of thanks is to be sent to ERYC for the new HGV signs, which should encourage most foreign HGV vehicles in avoiding the village centre.

Cave Lane Footpath – The whole verge was severely mown and now there are signs of surface damage and of plants breaking through the pathway surface. Annual maintenance could be a significant job.

Planning

Howdencroft – the demolition application has been approved.

Beckside Nursery – the radio mast application was approved.

Internal Audit – This function must now be performed by a non-Council Member. Mr David Wood has agreed to do the job and has been

appointed.

Village Hall Hire Fee – The proposed annual hire fee has more than doubled. In order to avoid a sudden jump in the annual village precept (part of the Council Tax which we all pay) the Council has suggested that the increase be phased in over a three year period.

Councillor training – There is pressure from central government for a more 'professional' approach to Council activities. For this to be accomplished more training is required and this will lead to an increase in expense claims. It was recognised that Councillors should not be out of pocket and so legitimate expenses, on approved training courses, should be paid from Council funds.

Miscellaneous – Concern was expressed at the amount of mud on the road from traffic using a site on Stonepit Road. - A working party is to clear excessive plant growth from the Beck on Sunday, 15th September. - The Clerk is investigating alternative sources of insurance cover with a view to reducing the annual premium. - Defective manhole covers have been replaced at Ring Beck crossroads. - Clarification to be sought on approved height for fencing.

Ellerker Show 2003




Great fun is had by all, at least by those taking part (we think); hopefully everyone who took part earlier this year will be approached in the next few weeks regarding their renewed participation!
