The Chairman, Tricia Christmas reported as follows:

The AGM of the Village Hall has come round once again, something which we are all proud of; although it has meant a lot of hard work for many people it means that we are surviving as a community.

The hard work has been in the forefront of my mind as the year rolled by. It takes dedication by many people for the Hall to function properly from keeping the diary, balancing the books, the cleaning, the maintenance, the Spring clean, the unlocking and locking of the door, the switching off of the alarm: the list goes on and I would like to thank everyone for their part in performing these and other tasks.

We have had regular bookings for art, dancing and Tai Chi classes and the Hall has been used by the WI, YCA, Neighbourhood Watch, Parish Council, Playing Field Committee, Church functions, Sunday School, The Scarecrow Festival, as well as private parties. Occasionally crockery and equipment has been loaned out for a small donation. All the village organisations send representatives to this committee.

As a result of our request for a home for the trestles and table tops we are pleased to report that Philip Wood has taken them on behalf of the Playing Field Committee and they can be used by other organisations.

One of the issues discussed this year has been the amalgamation with the Playing Field Committee but no final decision has been made. It would seem that taking all aspects into account there would be very little to gain.

This year the Hall has been used as a cinema under the umbrella of ArtERY. They have lottery sponsorship and provide the screen, back projector and speakers. We have to provide transport to collect and return it to Beverley and pay £100 to the film bank as royalties. We have 4 more films in the current programme. Unless we get more support it will not be viable to continue.

The Committee needs the Hall to be used and all who do come to the various events compliment us on how friendly, clean and warm it has become and we are the envy of many, so thank you once again for your support and we hope this will continue.

Bus Stop on Main Street

The petition was presented to Councillor M Groves ERYC on 15th October, you may have seen the article in the Hull Daily Mail, on 17th October.

Thank you to residents who attended the meeting and heard two apologies from ERYC saying that they had "got it wrong" discussions are still ongoing, when we have more news we will pass it on.



For residents who have received a questionnaire regarding buses, this doesn't mean we are going to lose our bus service, ERYC are looking into the issue of use of bus passes before 9.30 am.

Flood Update

The survey involving Water Voles has been concluded, we have to protect their habitat.

I am duty bound to tell you that we have been instructed to "pull the plug" on the drainage survey which we had arranged. The information we have already acquired will be shared with ERYC with whom we are now working, this will also cover the excess water and sewerage problems. If you have any concerns about sewerage (which could be a health issue) please contact the Parish Council.

Street Lights

It was suggested that we turn off the street lights between midnight and 7am to reduce the cost in these difficult times. We are awaiting the information from ERYC which says this will not save much money, we have a contract with them regarding maintenance.

Playing Field

The Ellerker Playing Field Committee approached the Council for £500 to help towards playing field running costs, to be included in the 2009/10 precept bid. The request was rejected 3-2.

Bulbs and Beck Cleaning

Residents have been busy planting 1000 bulbs which were donated to the village by ERYC. Looking forward to Spring.

Beck cleaning took place on 23rd November. A big thank you to those who took part (i.e. remember snow was on the ground – that's community spirit).

A hectic year all round for the Yorkshire Countrywomen's Association and now coming up to Christmas - I'll say no more!!



You will need access to the Internet to become a member of your local scheme, but once online all trading is free. The name of the network is Freecycle and it started in Arizona back in 2003.

The concept has since spread to over 85 countries, where there are thousands of local groups representing millions of members are changing the world one gift at a time. As a result, they are keeping over 500 tonnes a day out of landfills! The Hull group has over 3000 members.

By giving freely, members of the network help instill a sense of generosity of spirit as they strengthen local community ties and promote environmental sustainability and reuse. People from all walks of life have joined together to turn junk into treasure.
