Bus Shelter - a site meeting has been held with ERYC and the builder, Mr Thornham, the position of the shelter has been marked out. Work is due to start soon.

A63 interchange - Mr Rennie of ERYC Highways section addressed the Parish Council meeting on 6th February. He proposed a new road layout for the end of the interchange nearest the petrol filling station. It will involve some road re-alignment, a roundabout and a longer curved exit path from the dual carriageway. Money to make the changes is available and he reported that the work will take place this year. Inevitably there will be traffic disruption for the duration of the changes.

Oil spillage in beck - A number of people noticed the smell of oil and then the iridescent sheen on the water surface on Monday, 8th January. The source was traced to Brantingham, allegedly the source was a vandalised heating oil tank behind the Village Hall. An Ellerker resident informed the Environment Agency via ERYC. The pollution stretched through the village as far as Brough Haven. The Parish Council has decided not to press the EA for any action – it is

understood that the Brantingham Village Hall heating is being converted from oil to gas.



Sewage treatment - In order to meet EU directives, all effluent entering the Humber must be a

treated to an agreed standard by the end of 2003, at the moment a significant volume is untreated. Yorkshire Water meetings are being held every 2 to 3 months, to discuss where waste water treatment plants are going to be located, the Parish Clerk is representing Ellerker.

One option being considered is the routing of sewage from Brough and Elloughton to the Ellerker Waste Water Treatment Works (Ellerker WWTW) on Norfolk Bank Lane. At the moment the Ellerker WWTW takes the sewage from Newport to Newbald and all drops in between! The Works have been unable to cope with the flow during recent heavy rain and effluent has been flowing out of the works into the adjacent field and watercourse. The Council is naturally concerned at the prospect of more waste coming to the Parish. There will be a public exhibition of plans later this year.

Tree felling - It was re-stated that permission to fell trees inside the Ellerker Conservation Area must be obtained from ERYC before work can commence. Most people in the village are complying. If you are not clear whether or not your property is within the conservation area, please contact the Clerk to the Parish Council.

Planning Applications - Approvals: Ebenezer House and Mill House. Refusals: Stonepit Lane site and Ellerker Frowers (Ings Lane).

Pending: Hunsdale Propellant Powder Store - changes have been suggested to ERYC in order to make the development more acceptable.

Police - Nigel Stork has replaced Simon Gooding as the local Constable.

Annual Village Assembly - this will form part of the meeting in May.

The East Riding of Yorkshire Council has been awarded a £423,000 grant from Central Government for Rural Bus Challenge. The money is to be used to provide a dedicated dial-a-ride door to door service for hospital users in rural areas.

Each bus can carry 8 passengers (including 1 wheelchair)

- 1. Patients with hospital appointments.
- 2. Carers/friends accompanying patients.
- 3. People visiting patients in hospital.
- 4. Any other users if there's room.

There is a charge made for the service, but it is cheaper than a taxi.

ings are taken on a first come first served basis. You will be given a time when you will be collected and you will be contacted by phone if there is a delay. Arrange the return journey with the driver of the Medibus.

This prohibition shall apply until further notice.

A message from the Archbishop of York:

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

One of the most exciting things about our Diocese is the enormous variety of settings in which the Church is present. First there are the Parishes – nearly 500 of them with all their huge contrasts. Then there are the Hospitals, Prisons, Schools, Colleges, Farms, Selby Coal Field, Hull Docks, Teesside Industry. In all these and more the church has a presence both lay and ordained.

In this first year of a new Christian Millennium I invite the Diocese to pause and reflect. I am asking you to think once again about that fundamental question "What is the Church for?" I would like to hear about your plans for the Mission entrusted to you by Christ for your locality.

LIVING THE GOSPEL is essentially local in nature. We have no Blue Print for Mission to impose. I would like you to share your priorities with me. What is it that you are seeking to be and do in Christ's name? I realise that Stock Taking of this kind goes on all the time in different parts of the Diocese. But I believe there is real merit in asking every church to address the same fundamental questions at the same time. This will, I hope, encourage a deepening sense of unity in Mission, and enable us better "To Bear One Another's Burdens and so fulfil the Law of Christ".

The outcome of a review of this kind might actually mean less work and fewer activities! Canon Robert Warren works with a large number of churches and he concludes that healthy churches often do fewer things – but to a higher standard. (Like the Ellerker Village Concert)

LIVING THE GOSPEL is a Mission initiative. It is aimed at supporting you in your discipleship in your particular locality. I need to know how the Diocesan Leadership can help you in fulfilling your witness and mission in this 21st Century.
