



Norfolk Bank Lane

Councillor's Allowances

The Council had received a letter from ERYC encouraging Parish Councillors to consider being paid Allowances.

After some discussion, it was agreed unanimously, that Ellerker Parish Councillors would not claim allowances. Members are

satisfied that as long as they are not out of pocket through serving on the Council, there is no need to claim an Allowance.

Mill Hill Salt Bin

A 2nd Salt Bin for Mill Hill is to be requested from ERYC, the Council don't know yet whether or not it will be 'free' or will have to be paid for from Parish funds.

Notice Board

A new Notice Board is to be purchased from Parish funds and the existing one refurbished and placed in the Hill Top Bus Shelter.

Parish Council Clerk

The Clerk has handed in his resignation and will finish Council work at the end of March 2004. Members agreed that he has done a sterling job for over 7½ years. Advertising for a new Clerk will commence before the end of December, with ideally, a handover period before April.

Precept for 2004/2005

There was a long debate about whether or not the costs for the training of a new Clerk and for the maintenance of the Beck should be included in the coming year's budget. Along with other unavoidable increases it would have required an increase in Precept of 24%. This was considered to be too high, so these two items have been excluded. Consequently the increase for the Parish for the coming year will be $\mathfrak{L}216$ or about $\mathfrak{L}1.60$

per average household, it was decided however, that half the increase would be paid from reserves. The new Clerk's training costs will be taken from reserves if necessary.

Minute Books

It is recognised that the Council Minute Books represent an important piece of social history of the village. The Clerk holds the current Minute Book which starts in 1990 and also the one covering the period 1910 - 1955. The one covering the period from the formation of the Parish Council to 1910 is held by a former Council Chairman and it was agreed that this should be placed in the County Archives at Beverley, after first being copied to CD-ROM for village records. Sadly, the Minute Book for the period 1955 - 1990 went 'missing' over 10 years ago — if anyone knows the whereabouts of this book please inform a member of the Council or the Clerk.

Playing Fields

Railings painting

The white railings around the small field are badly in need of painting. So far we have been unable to find anyone to re-paint them at a reasonable cost.

National Playing Fields Association

Looking to future generations in the village, we are doing our best to secure the Fields 'in perpetuity'. There are two aspects to this: one is to ensure that the fields can never be sold and the other is to ensure that there is funding to keep the Fields viable in the future.

The Committee does have the power at the moment to dispose of the Fields, but only with the consent of a village meeting and the DETR, so it would be very unlikely to happen. Nevertheless,

we are looking at what is required to change the governing document to remove the power to dispose of the property.

The main expense items every year are the insurance for 3rd



party liability, the annual inspection and the mowing. If we were to transfer the 'custodian trusteeship' to the National Playing Fields Association, they would provide the insurance and annual inspection free of charge and this would remove almost half our annual expense. This sounds too good to be true and we are doing our best to discover if there is a 'catch' to this arrangement. If we were to pursue an agreement with the NPFA, a condition is that the power to dispose has to be removed.

Moles

We noticed earlier in the year that there was an incursion of moles. One of them was cheeky enough to pop up inside the Marquee, when the wedding reception was being held on the Green. The mole or moles are now well established and it is proving problematic to evict them. We have tried trapping and a chemical deterrent so far without much success. We need to remove them before mowing commences next season or the ride-on mower is at risk of getting bogged down.

Slide mound

There is a natural tendency for the soil at the top of the mound to migrate to the bottom and in the dry weather the new turf at the sides of the slide became badly eroded. New turf has been laid and steps have been built, in an effort to encourage users to stay off the new grass. An archaeological dig uncovered the rubber mats at the base of the slide and beyond them a sand runoff has been provided for those who exceed the statutory speed limit. In the process about half a tonne of soil was returned from base camp to the summit.

Litter Bins

The three round litter bins were in need of repair and renovation, we could have asked East Riding of Yorkshire Council to assist but they might have replaced them with the black plastic ones which are now commonly seen. Thanks to John May an excellent job has been done in replacing and treating the wooden spars and repairing/ replacing the steel inners on the existing bins.

Jumble Sale

The Jumble Sale in October raised £169.78, many thanks to those who donated things for sale and to the helpers who have to sort the items, haggle with the customers and clear up afterwards.

Christmas Party

This annual event for village children will take place on Saturday, 10th January, from 4pm to 6pm. Please return your invitations as soon as possible to ensure that you get a present from Father Christmas, who is once gain taking time off from his New Year holiday to call in on Ellerker.

Neighbourhood Watch Quiz
