Edith Annie Wood 1909 - 2009

A life span of over 100 years has ended with the death of Edith Wood, a life wholly spent in Ellerker, apart from her secondary schooling and her final years of illness.

In her active years she was one of the strong personalities of the village, with her cooking skills, her poultry keeping and Parish Council membership. Village sports were held in her grass paddock, before the village green and playing field were bought, aided by her money raising efforts.

With the help of her brother-in-law Jack Wood, she kept the last dairy herd in the centre of the village, the milking parlour was where The Granary now stands.

She was President of Ellerker Women's Institute for over 20 years and was a founder member of the Yorkshire Countrywomen's Association, in her later years she was its only honorary member.

As a Women's Institute national judge of cookery, she was a familiar figure in her white overall, white tea towel over her arm, cutting a fruit cake in half, tasting a morsel from the middle and writing her comments with care. For trifle she abhorred a base of sponge soaked in jelly and insisted on sherry and fruit juice for her method.

She liked to recount how she toured the village selling bricks for half a crown (12½p), to raise money for the building of the Village Hall in 1929. Each was fired with the donor's name inscribed and when the cloakrooms were added in later years, the design allowed for the bricks to remain revealed, with their little bit of history and a remembrance of her efforts.

She was pre-deceased by her former husband Jim and her younger daughter Jenni-

fer. Her elder daughter Barbara, Jennifer's husband David and her grand children remember her with pride.

Country life was strange at first for Margaret but gradually she settled and became one of the villagers and learnt the language of Yorkshire. She took an 8 week crash course in driving and passed her test enabling her to get out and about. The bus service in Ellerker was not a patch on Birmingham!

Margaret was an excellent mother to Alison, Helen and John and "Special Gran" to 7 grandchildren and 3 great grandchildren.

Her hobby was knitting and all her children and grandchildren, along with many others in the village, always had the most wonderful garments made by her gifted hands. When she ran out of youngsters to knit for Margaret used her spare time and wool to knit for the premature babies at the National Intensive Care Unit at The Women and Children's Hospital, Hull and other hospitals.

A lot of the knitting was done whilst relaxing in a deck chair at several caravan sites around the country which Peter and Margaret visited during their caravanning years. Margaret loved to walk Helen's dog Beau, sometimes she would take 30 minutes another time 60 minutes, depending on who she met and chatted to.

Sadly Margaret's health started to deteriorate and knitting, walking and caravanning came to an end, but she always remained positive and supportive towards her family and friends.

Margaret passed away suddenly on Sunday, 25th October 2009. "A very special lady who will be sadly missed" GOD BLESS
