Vera Harlington 1930-2010

Vera was born in Ellerker one of seven children to Mr & Mrs Ernie Land, her parents both lived to a great age and Vera nursed them until the end. That care and concern for others marked her life more than anything else. Vera worked hard, was married for 20 years and brought up four terrific children practically single-handed. She worked on the land, she worked at a local chicken farm and she worked for other people helping out in all sorts of domestic work. She earned money and kept the family together.

Her dad was one of the few who survived The Somme and the rest of the First World War and I think she had the same guts and determination to survive for her kids. She now has ten grandchildren and fifteen great grandchildren.

Self-giving service and generosity were in

her nature. She always gave to charities and to whoever asked for help. The family say that though she had very little and never went away on holiday or treated herself to anything big, she was happy and contented with life, she never wanted anything.

Although she spent 66 years at Ellerker and 14 years at North Cave and though she loved her bungalow in North Cave it was kind of fitting that she should spend those last seven weeks in Fern Villa back to her roots in Ellerker. The Family would like me to thank Lesley the manageress at Fern Villa and the staff particularly Andy who she thought the world of, for the wonderful way in which he looked after their Mum.

As most of you will know Vera loved to knit and to crochet, she was constantly making toys, baking which she would do for everyone around her. She fed the neighbours children when they came round to play, she could make anything out of nothing. And if the children were ill she would sit up all night with them, never thinking of going to bed herself. And of course we mustn't forget her love of animals particularly birds which she fed all the time and especially cats. Her special pet was Blackie her cat, born under the shed and lived with Vera for fourteen years, following her everywhere.

Bubbling Sewers?

As some residents in Ellerker already know we are having problems with the sewer network.

During periods of heavy rain many of the sewer inspection hatches in the village, mainly those down Main Street and continuing down Ings Lane, “bubble up”. This escape of effluent from the sewer system is obviously undesirable.

The Parish Council and ERYC are actively pressing Yorkshire Water to rectify the problem. We have been informed that one way to help push Ellerker toward the top of the “repairs list” is for residents to telephone and tell Yorkshire Water every time this

problem is noticed. Writing and notifying them of the problem is also very important.

The more complaints they receive the higher up the list we go. Unfortunately their system is largely complaints driven and it's a case of those who shout the loudest.....!

The telephone number to report escaping effluent is: 0845 1242424. You will need to quote your postcode, and advise them there is “an outflow from the foul sewer”, also report any smells etc. The address for written complaints is: Yorkshire Water, PO Box 52, Bradford, BD3 7YD.

Drainage

Yorkshire Water has agreed that there are issues with the drains in the village such as the silting up of pipes and ground water entering the pipes and reducing capacity. Villagers should contact Yorkshire Water directly about any problems they suffer with regards to drainage, as the more complaints that are flagged up the more likely they are to take action.



Bus Stop

Both David Boden at the East Riding Council and Barry Marsden at East Yorkshire Motor Services have stated that the bus stop in Main Street will remain in its present form and that they are not prepared to discuss the matter any further with the Parish Council.

Playing Fields

The Playing Field Committee has been allocated the sum of £200.00, which will be paid through the Parish Precept.

Roads and verges

The roads in Ellerker have fared very badly over the winter and we have large number of new potholes. We will raise this with ERYC in the near future when they visit the village to record what maintenance the village requires. The grass verges have also suffered damage, mainly from motor vehicles. Along with other parishes, we have also suffered theft from the salt bins over the snowy period.
