Ellerker Wind Farm

WED RENEWABLES held a "Community Consultation Event" in the Village Hall on 27 November. The purpose of the event was to consult the local community about a wind farm proposal and options for how the community fund could be spent.

The Parish Council understands that WED Renewables propose to erect 3 wind turbines, each 121 metres tall, to the south west of Ellerker. The application for planning permission is anticipated to be made in early 2014.

The PC considers that the proposal warrants a public meeting. When the planning application is made, a meeting will be arranged so that residents can discuss the matter and put forward their views. Such a meeting will be advertised on the village noticeboards.

Parish Boundary Walk 2013

We arrived at the top of Brantingham Dale at 11am as predicted and there, as planned, were Hugh & Tricia Christmas with lots of lovely goodies to eat and drink. With also David Wood providing roving support and commentary.

Just before 9am twenty three of us had gathered at the village hall, had our photos taken as a group, then set off just after the hour. The weather was cool, with a light breeze and slightly overcast, so good for walking, we headed off down Cave Lane joining the parish boundary at Stonepit Road.

The walk route is a combination of roadside, public pathway and field margins. It can't follow the boundary precisely but does so as closely as possible, bearing in mind that there are some parts that we are unable to get permission to walk and other parts are impassable. The total length is between 15 and 16 miles and at it's lowest point is at approximately sea level (between the Humber Bank and the railway) and at it's highest 164m (538ft) at the OS trig point on Great Wold near Fox Covert Farm.

Having followed the boundary line to the A63 we

Following Dale Road we walked through Brantingham village, past The Triton pub and down Outgo across the 'old A63' then traversed the footpath behind Cockle Pits Wood to join Whin Moor Lane, turning left here and soon to Whinney Moor Farm for our second refreshment stop at Chris & Joy Bradley's with Julie Strong in the kitchen handing out the goodies to the warm and slightly weary walkers. By now it was 2pm and this marked the approximate half way point of the route, Tina and Alison had had enough by now, so stayed behind in the swinging seat!

One of the really outstanding walkers was young Sam Hurley who seemed to have boundless energy and couldn't wait to get on to the next stop each time

Following our 45 minute lunch stop we continued across to Sands Lane and followed this down to the field next to the reservoir where we crossed the railway and on to the Humber Bank, then headed West to Crabley. More rest and refreshments in the yard at Crabley Farm kindly provided by Liz Nicholls. We were ready for the finish by now and my blisters were beginning to hurt!



crossed the A1034 near South Cave and made our way along tracks and field boundaries to Woo Dale, then followed the ascent to Mount Airy which is the steepest part of the walk. The view of the Humber from here is quite amazing on a clear day.

Passing the farm on our left we followed the footpath alongside the airfield and emerged on the Riplingham Road which we followed to meet Dale Road and our first (and very welcome) refreshment stop (see above).

Following the bank of Crabley Drain and then Mires Beck we re-joined the road at Norfolk Bank Lane close to the sewage works and headed north-east towards the point where had started on the boundary route, we had been here some six and a half hours earlier.

Turning right at Cavegates crossroads it was just another 15 minutes and we were back at the Village Hall at 4pm, with Sam Hurley racing to get there first! Another group photo or two on the pump triangle and then into the hall for more

delicious food and drink provided by Jessie Puckering and friends - we must have been substantially heavier at the finish than we were at the start.

So a big thank you to all who took part in the walk and another big one for those who supported the walkers

Together we raised a total of £1,508 and so cheques for £377 went to:
