The Parish Council met on 15th March for the Bi-Monthly Council Meeting, along with the Annual Council Meeting on 10th May 2018. The Parish Council also facilitated the Annual Parish Meeting on the 10th May 2018 at which time groups from the Parish were invited to share details of activities completed in the past year and plans for the next 12 months.

ERYC Council Tax will increase by 5.99% for the year 2018/19. This will be an increase of approx. £80 for a Band D house. This increase will generate an additional £9m in revenue. Spending on Adult Services will increase by £10m to £60m in total. Council Housing rents will reduce by 1% and Staff costs increase by 2%.

The Annual Governance and Accountability Return (AGAR) for the year ending 31 March 2018 has been completed by the Parish Council with full details available on the Parish Website and village notice-boards. The Parish Council continues to implement the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) requirements.

Work continues on projects to improve the ambience of the village in the short and medium term. The Parish Council met with representatives of ERYC to discuss key projects and agree solutions during the Village Walk About on 27th April 2018. The Parish Council continues to work to address resident concerns with regards to Speeding, Parking and Verge maintenance. Please can any further suggestions to enhance the ambience of the village be submitted to the clerk via the contact form available on the Ellerker Parish website or directly to any Parish Councillor.

The Allotment Working Group are pleased to confirm that the wild-flower meadow has been sown and is progressing well for part of the Stonepits Field Allotment Gardens. Fruit will shortly be available for local residents to pick from the allotments. Please contact the Clerk via the contact form on the website if you are interested in becoming an allotment tenant.
