Parish Council News

The Parish Council met on 9th May 2019 for the Annual Council Meeting. The Parish Council also facilitated the Annual Parish Meeting on the 9th May 2018 at which time groups from the Parish were invited to share details of activities completed in the past year and plans for the next 12 months. The minutes of both meetings are available to view on the Ellerker Parish website.

The Great British Spring Clean / Annual Litter Pick took place on Saturday 23rd March 2019. The 30 volunteers contributing to the Annual Litter Pick gathered 63 bags of litter and assorted items this year, along with 24 lorry and car tyres that had been fly tipped intermittently along Norfolk Bank and Mires Bank Lane. Sewell's kindly provided refreshments as well as equipment and additional helpers on the day, for which the Parish Council is most grateful.

A Community Public Access Defibrillator Awareness Session took place on Thursday 11th April 2019 at the Village Hall. A demonstration of how to access and use the Defibrillator was completed by the Yorkshire Ambulance Service. Donations made on the evening were made to the Yorkshire Air Ambulance.

The Men's race of the Tour de Yorkshire passed through Ellerker on Thurs 2nd May 2019. The Parish Council and Ellerker Community Groups worked with our neighbouring Councils to celebrate this world class event. Events took place on the day on the Playing Fields and near the Village Hall with £415 raised for Help for Heroes. Helium was donated to inflate balloons by Energas and portable toilets donated by Ellerker Lodge. We entered the "Best dressed village" competition but unfortunately Ellerker did not achieve a place in the top 6 entries.

Following the local Council elections on Thurs 2nd May 2019, the 7 current Councillors have been re-elected unopposed. Following the ERYC elections we are delighted to have continuity in Councillors Meredith and Smith and to welcome Terry Gill in his successful election.

The Annual Governance and Accountability Return (AGAR) for the year ending 31 March 2019 has been completed by the Parish Council. The dates set for the period of exercise of public rights commences on 17th June 2019 and ends on 26th July 2019. During this period the Annual Governance Statement and Accounting Statements for



2018/19 will be available to view on the Parish noticeboards and the website.

The Parish Council are working with ERYC to complete a feasibility study with regards to a Neighbourhood Plan. Ellerker is a beautiful Yorkshire village and justifiably deserves its conservation status whilst still retaining a fine community spirit and being a great place to live. With a Neighbourhood Plan, our community would have the power to direct new development, using our own planning policies, which will work in conjunction with the East Riding of Yorkshire Council's Local Plan and the National Planning Policy Framework. A Neighbourhood Plan would set out a vision for the Parish for the next 15 years that would build on and reflect the opinions and views of parish residents. The Plan is designed to build on the East Riding of Yorkshire Council's Local Plan so that we may have greater influence on planning and consenting activities in the future. The aim of the Plan will be to retain and build upon the Parish's strengths as a rural thriving village that works together in a rural community with the neighbouring villages. The objective is to achieve sustainable development that meets housing, social, environmental and community needs whilst protecting the environment, improving green space and conserving the character and

fabric of the village for future generations.

Work continues on projects to improve the ambience of the village in the short and medium term. Work to address residents' concerns with regards to Speeding, Parking and Verge maintenance continues. Quotations are being obtained in conjunction with the Playing Fields and Village Hall Committees for a larger notice board adjacent to the Village Hall.


Playing Field Update and Ellerker Fayre!
