A roundup of news from around the parish — Issue 90 — Spring 2020



Residents will be concerned at the speed that the Coronavirus is taking hold and the significant impact the uncertainty is having on all of our lives. It has now been confirmed that there is one case of the virus in our village.

Ellerker benefits from being a tight-knit community with good organisational infrastructure and a prepared Emergency Plan.

The Church, Parish Council and Neighbourhood Watch are working together to ensure a co-ordinated response so that residents in need are supported. Guidance from the Government is changing daily and our local response will need regular updating. Communications will be made electronically through extra editions of Ellerker News, which reaches 125 house via email and the remaining 25 houses via hard copy.

Our village is divided into 5 zones, each covered by a Parish Councillor and 2 Neighbourhood Watch Co-ordinators. Residents will shortly receive a leaflet drop to remind them of the contact details for their zone. Please

keep this to hand so that they can be contacted for support particularly if individuals are isolated. To minimize unnecessary face to face contact, telephone and/ or email contact will be the recommended method of communication. Residents who wish to offer their help to neighbours will be most welcome and they should make themselves known to their Neighbourhood Co-ordinator. Sharing the load will become increasingly important as the days progress and more people have to isolate themselves.

Following a meeting with the Vicar and Church Wardens. it has been decided that all services, apart from funerals, will be cancelled until further notice. St Anne's will remain open as normal during the day for drop in as a place for quiet reflection and prayer during this troubling time. Those entering the church will be asked to use the alcohol hand sanitizer, which is on order from Costcutter. The Vicar will be present at the church this Sunday at 9.30 but will not be leading a service of worship. As it is Mothering Sunday, daffodils have been ordered for distribution during that service. These will now be left at the entrance to the

church for parishioners to collect themselves. The Celtic Service and the Lent Programme have all been cancelled. Specific updates from the Church of England will be posted on www.allsaintssouthcave.co.uk along with some guidance for personal worship and prayer support, in due course.

The situation worldwide is now serious and dangerous and residents are encouraged to listen to the scientific guidance and to act responsibly. Staying positive and responsive to the changing advice will be crucial, as will helping each other in a compassionate but safe way.

Flood and Sewage Plans

Following the November flooding and the ongoing high levels of rainfall, the Parish Council continue to seek to engage with representatives of the key authorities to reduce the risks posed by the rainfall and sewage.

Representatives of the Parish Council and residents met with Lee Pitcher (Yorkshire Water Head of Resilience and LWW General Manager) on 10th March 2020 to agree a plan of action with regards to the unacceptable discharge of sewage on the streets and fields of Ellerker along with the concerns in respect of the ability of the Sewage Treatment works to cope with the volume of waste.

A 4-phase approach is to be implemented including formulating a full multi agency review and action plan by the end of April 2020.

Residents are respectfully reminded of the 3 Ps principle of loo flushing! They are Pee, Poo and Paper only!

Representatives of the Parish Council are meeting with Mike Kitching (Assistant Principal Engineer ERYC Flood Risk Management Team) on 18th March to discuss the continued issues with flooding on Ings Lane and the corner of Main Street / Howden Croft Hill. A survey of Ellerker Beck will also be completed to confirm the work that is required to reduce the potential for flooding from the Beck.

The Ellerker Community
Emergency Plan has been
updated following the
purchase of a small stock of
Sandbags to be deployed to
protect vulnerable
properties in the event of
future flood water
emergencies.

These are located in the yard of Pidgeoncote Farm, thanks to William Puckering.
Requests for support have

also been made to the Highways Agency, Environment Agency, Ouse and Humber Drainage Board and Ward Councillors.
